Project Update

The City of Saskatoon (City) will be crack sealing the road adjacent to your household this construction season. This involves applying a hot rubberized asphalt material to seal cracks caused by the asphalt expanding and contracting due to changes in temperature. Crack sealing will extend the lifespan of the road and reduce the chances of the cracks turning into potholes. Points Athabasca Contracting has been awarded the contract.

The work is scheduled to begin on October 8, 2017 and take approximately one day to complete.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience during this project.

Other Facts About the Project:

- “NO PARKING” signs will be posted in advance to give notice of when the work will begin.
- While the work is underway, barricades and signage will be installed; however, we ask that you stay clear of the work zone for your safety.
- During construction, heavy machinery will be used which has some noise and vibration.
- Emergency vehicles will have access to all households adjacent to the work zone.
- **Please refrain from watering your lawns for the duration of construction, as it will delay the project.**

Frequently Asked Questions

Will there be traffic restrictions?

Yes. Assiniboine Drive from Warman Road to Ravine Drive will be partially closed.

Will parking be affected?

Yes. For households/businesses adjacent to the work in progress, access to driveways and on-street parking will be restricted. Alternative parking will need to be used around the neighbourhood.

Will my garbage and recycling collection services be affected?

No. The garbage and recycling collection services will not be affected.

Will my water and sewer service be affected?

No. The City is not expecting any water or sewer interruptions.

Will the bus routes change?

Bus routes along the construction route may be affected throughout the project. During construction, please check the signs posted for alternate bus stop locations or call Saskatoon Transit at 306-975-3100.

Will rain delay completion of the work?

Yes. Rain could delay the project. If rain delays are experienced, the schedule will be shifted accordingly.
